You may be interested in my first impressions - and they are that I am delighted to have joined a team of committed cooperative and polite staff who are working with such happy, highly motivated, and enthusiastic students!

We all know that parents want their children to be successful and happy, and that for children the latter arises from making friends and participating in engaging activities not only within and but also outside formal lessons - i.e., via the range of extra - curricular provision that can encompass calendar festivities, creative expression and sporting and other competitive events.

It is with that in mind that we will soon introduce the time-honoured feature of nearly all Commonwealth -based international schools - the House System, whereby students join a particular House, designated by a colour, emblem, and identity. Each school chooses its own theme, and our students will be able to elect ours by ballot from themes that have already been discussed and agreed in each class.

The House system promotes a sense of collective spirit and team endeavour, enables children to make friends outside their class and year group, and fully develops individual leadership skills. It can teach how to lose gracefully - as that is sure to happen in life from time to time as we all know - and so can therefore also show how to bounce back quickly as well! Further, it demonstrates how positive behaviour is acknowledged and rewarded through the awarding of House Points for effort and exemplary conduct, which of course brings its own kudos. And it enables students to compete in areas where they may not initially feel able and so identify potential skills or aptitudes that can lead to future competitiveness in intra- and inter-school events: indeed, such accomplishments can often strongly augment university and employment applications as well.



SUBJECT SHOWCASE

GIG International School aims at a 4Q learning framework that focuses on a 4-dimensional approach to teaching-learning practices.

Just as everyone has a unique fingerprint, every student has an individual learning style. Chances are, not all students grasp a subject in the same way or share the same level of ability. Every student is unique and so is the way they work.

As educators we all believe that every child is special, unique, and different from another. Differentiation is the instruction that helps students with diverse academic needs and learning styles master the same challenging academic content. It means providing interrelated activities that are based on student needs for the purpose of ensuring that all students have a similar grasp over a skill or idea. It allows learners the ability to demonstrate learning in a variety of ways.

The assessment task in this Class 4 plan allowed for multiple entry points, interests, backgrounds, real world connection, preferred learning style and ability.







Learners created a model on the Respiratory System and presented it, where they showcased comprehension and social skills. Learners differentiated between respiration and breathing, and then did a presentation which also showcased their communication skills. Learners connected all life processes with the human body organ system and presented it, where they displayed their critical thinking skills.


Learners were challenged to question or deepen their thinking. Inquiry-based learning is centred around students' interests and questions. Engagement is high and students are motivated to explore, problem-solve, and use critical thinking as they work through the inquiry process.

NATIONAL DAY









While our young learners moved to Home-based learning, Singapore's 56th birthday was celebrated with extra zeal.

In the ITE Class, Students of Grade 2 learnt how to draw a Singapore Flag in Tux paint. Drawing a perfect crescent moon using their free hand on the computer screen could have been a challenge, hence, the children adopted a method where they learnt to draw two circles, one in white colour and another in red colour, overlapping each other. This resulted in a sharp edged, perfect crescent moon of the Singapore flag to appear on their screens. For the kids, it was like magic and their faces immediately brightened in astonishment and happiness of having achieved something that they strived for. This resulted into a memorable Singapore National Day for the children.

In the Art Class, the students recreated the story of Singapore, and created beautiful pictures of the landmarks around the nation.





LANGUAGE WEEK

We at GIG truly believe in multiculturalism and diversity and what better way than linguistic diversity among our student community. Over the month of August, we celebrated the beauty of languages with a range of activities, games and competitions. A glimpse of the same is as follows.

French Language Week

Language week has been a great opportunity to celebrate French culture in our class.

The students have learnt cultural facts about France: the flag, the Eiffel Tower, a symbol of the country: the rooster, the motto "Libertй, Йgalitй, Fraternitй", the national anthem "La Marseillaise", the typical food: le pain, les croissants, le fromage.

Following this presentation, the students have prepared a poster showing their best representation of French culture.





















Hindi Language Week



This was a part of Language Week celebration, to celebrate the glory of Hindi language which is widely spoken by over 366 million speakers worldwide. The language is not just restricted to India but is also widely spoken in nations like Mauritius, Fiji, Guyana, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago. We at GIG, celebrated the Hindi language week by hosting a Fancy Dress competition, singing competition and poster making competition.




