Today, I'd like to write about raising standards of written and spoken English.

All the evidence says that the most effective way to strengthen vocabulary, grammar and sentence construction is through wide reading and I'm very glad to say the new readers for the Library will be arriving soon. The plan is that access to a wide range of titles will promote learners' levels of understanding, critical appreciation and overall enthusiasm for different literary genres and we'll also introduce a structured reading programme that will assess precisely these aptitudes. Further, I cannot overstress the importance of vocabulary building: English boasts the largest of dictionaries as it is blessed with at least five root languages that reflect the different peoples who invaded the British Isles over a relatively short period. You might be speaking words of Celtic, Latin, Anglo-Saxon, Norse (Viking) or Norman French origin, even in the same sentence, giving you the same means of precise expression that were at the disposal of The Greats such as Shakespeare, Jane Austen or George Orwell.

To help with vocabulary acquisition, I will be encouraging all learners to maintain their own personal dictionary wherein they record all new words and their meanings, expressed in a few sample sentences to demonstrate confidence in use. A wide and precise vocabulary will determine how we fare in many academic subjects - not just English - and also shape our lives by helping us to landing the prize job, attract the right friends and even help steer us through some of the tricky situations in life: there's no doubt about it - Word Are Power!
